### Friday 1 March: The pros and cons of Wireless Technology

Over the course of the past few years **Alan Cooke** has spent copious amounts of time and money researching the effects of Radiofrequency radiation and attended many lectures with top independent scientists and doctors to learn more about the biological effects that wireless technology can have upon health.



His talk opens with how he first became interested in researching the subject to giving advice on precautionary measures we can all take around the home. Alan has over 40 years' experience working as a trainer both in his own business and for various others including the aviation industry and is now a regular speaker in a wide range of contexts.

### Friday 5 April: The Donald Campbell Story

#### Phil Holt



Travel across the lake with **Phil Holt**, professional after dinner speaker, into the charismatic, daring, and brave character that was Donald Campbell. There is much more to be told about Donald than the events at Coniston Water; he is the only man in history to hold both the world land and water speed records in the same year.

What pushed him to that final fateful attempt at the world water speed record?

Using clever reconstruction, go behind the scenes of that fateful day in January 1967 to find the cause of the crash. Phil will finish, movingly, with the recovery of both Bluebird and Donald himself from Coniston Water and the restoration efforts currently underway.

### Friday 3 May: The History of Policing the Railway

#### Kevin Gordon

Our speaker, **Kevin Gordon** visited us before to speak about the Houses of Parliament. He spent 34 years as a British Transport Police Officer and was a founder member of the Force History Society. Kevin will explain that the railway police were one of the earliest organised police forces in the country. Indeed, there were railway policemen before there were railways! The Railway Police were the first police force in the UK to employ women and the first to use police dogs. Kevin will end the talk giving an overview of his time in the force including some interesting arrests!

### Friday 15 February Philosophy in a Day!

Marianne Talbot, Oxford University

**Marianne Talbot** will take us on another journey through the history and methodology of philosophy. This will be an interactive day - so come prepared to think for yourself!

### Friday 15 March The Bayeux Tapestry and life in England before the Battle of Hastings

Imogen Corrigan, Lecturer for The Arts Society



The Tapestry is not just a narrative of the most famous battle in English history, but also of the build-up to it: about a third is given to the Breton campaign of 1064 but intriguingly, many crucial events are omitted and we can only speculate as to why. It is a moral story showing that good cannot come to those who break their word. It is a story of kings, chivalry and ambition, some of this hidden in symbolism. We will look at many of the scenes in detail and explore what might be learned from this depiction of a turning point in our history.

### Friday 12 April The Aztec - The Eagle Warriors of the Sun

Maria Chester, U3A Subject Advisor on American Archaeology.



The Aztec also called Mexica borrowed much of their culture from the ancient Toltec. They liked to associate themselves with the splendour and magnificence of Teotihuacan. The name "Aztec" in Nahuatl means "People from Aztlan". Their capital city, Tenochtitlan, was founded on 8th June 1325. When the Spaniards walked into Tenochtitlan, they found a well organised society. The capital city had four public markets, five days a week. Hernan Cortés – the Spanish Conquistador – reported that 60,000 people daily visited the central market of Tlatelolco. As all other Mesoamerican cultures, the Aztecs played a variant of the Mesoamerican ball game, named "tlachtli". Human sacrifice was the most striking feature of Aztec civilisation. Before the conquest there were fifteen million Aztecs. By 1521 only four million survived.
